


Religious Education Y4, Summer Term: Christianity-How did Jesus teach about God and values through parables?

| Parable | A very short story told to teach a moral or religious lesson. Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan teaches us that it is as important to help strangers as it is to help friends. |
| Pharisee | A person who belonged to a religious group who clashed with Jesus and his ideas. They were known for being self-righteous and proud. They were determined to stop Jesus' influence over the people. Pharisees were Jewish and believed in keeping ceremonies and oral laws as well as the written laws. |
| Humility | By living a humble life, you recognize the areas of your life that need work. You act as if you are not especially important or special. |
| Tax Collector | Is a person who collects unpaid taxes from other people or businesses. Tax collectors are often portrayed in fiction as being evil, and in the modern world share a similar stereotype to that of lawyers. |
| Pride | Means having a feeling of being good and worthy They can be <i>proud</i> of something good that they have done. They can be <i>proud</i> of (or take <i>pride</i> in) their work. They might be <i>proud</i> of their son or daughter or husband or wife or anyone else who is close to them and who has done something good. |
| Persistence in Prayer | To persevere, not to give up but to continue to pray for the same thing. To be tenacious and determined in prayer. |
| Kingdom of God | This means that God reigns over the heavens and the Earth. God reigns supreme and Jesus is King. God's authority is recognised and his will is obeyed, as in The Lord's Prayer- 'Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on Earth as it is in heaven'. |
| Gospel | The word 'gospel' means good news. In Christianity, the term "good news" refers to the story of Jesus Christ's birth, death, and resurrection. |
