Residential Visits

Sadly, we have had to cancel the majority of residential visits, which we were due to run this academic year due to the current regulations. However, there is a chance that we might be able to proceed with the Year 6 visit to the Lake District as this has been booked for the beginning of July and providing that the country follows the roadmap out of lockdown set out by the Government, this should be a possibility.

Due to the cancellation of residential visits this academic year, we have booked the following visits for each year group from September 2021. Please note that these dates are provisional and will only be confirmed when a further letter has been distributed and if we are permitted to run visits to these locations:

13th -15th October 21: Year 2 visit to Hartington (Current Year 1)

20th -22nd October 21: Year 3 visit to Anglesey (Current Year 2)

5th, 6th and 7th January 22: Year 1 visit to Tattenhall (Current Year R) One night per group.

9th -11th February 22: Year 4 visit to York (Current Year 3)

23rd -27th May 22: Year 6 visit to the Lake District (Current Year 5)

Current Year 4 visit still to be confirmed.

Any money banked currently for a visit will automatically be transferred to next year's visit, unless you notify us otherwise. Please note that this will not show in your account due to the money collection system used, but rest assured all balances will be transferred accordingly.
