| Resurrection | Means a 'raising up', or 'rising up'. The Christian belief that God raised Jesus after his crucifixion as first of the dead, starting his exalted life as Christ and Lord. His resurrection is the guarantee that all the Christian dead will be resurrected at Christ's second coming. |
| Servanthood | Jesus was the ultimate servant during his life on earth because he willingly gave up his life for us. Christians honour his example of servanthood by serving others in their daily lives. |
| Humility | By living a humble life, you recognize the areas of your life that need work. You act as if you are not especially important or special. |
| Salvation | The saving of a person from sin or evil. |
| Lent | Lent is a period of six weeks before Easter. Christians are supposed to be quiet and thoughtful, preparing themselves for Easter. They should pray a lot, give money to charities and give up some of the things they might otherwise do for pleasure. |
| Stations of the Cross | There are fourteen stations, representing an event during Christ's Passion. Walking in the footsteps of Jesus. |
| Sacrifice | Is a loss or something you give up, usually for the sake of a better cause. When dealing with the Hebrew Bible, "sacrifice" is best defined as the ritual slaughtering of animals. |
| Good Friday | A Christian tradition to mark the day when Jesus was nailed to the cross. Some believe that the good about Good Friday is that Jesus gave up his life for his people and then came back at Easter, proving that he indeed was the Son of God. |
