Humanist	Someone who believes in the values of Humanism.
Humanism	A worldview which is not religious. Believe the world is a natural place, should be free to do what makes us happy, should be kind to people, animals and the planet. One life to live.
Atheist	A person who does not believe in God.
Agnostic	A person who accepts people can't know whether God exists or not.
Theist	A person who believes in the existence of a god or gods, specifically of a creator who intervenes in the universe.
Empathy	Being able to understand and share the feelings of others.
Golden Rule	To treat others as you wish to be treated yourself. Seen in many worldviews. An ethical principle.
Human Rights	A right which is believed to belong to every human regardless of race, sex, nationality, ethnicity, language, religion, or any other status.
Celebrant	Someone who leads a special ceremony marking a life event including the welcoming of a baby, a wedding and a funeral.
The Big Bang	The scientific view of how the world began
