Dear Parents / Carers

It has been a very special week welcoming the children back to school and welcoming all our new pupils and parents. All children have settled in really well and are now becoming familiar with their new classes and school routines.

School Timings

Please may I remind all concerned that the following school timings will apply from 6th September:

Year Group	Start time	Finish time
Reception, Year 1 and Year 2	8.45am	3.05pm.
Year 3 –Year 6	8.55am	3.15pm

We realise that this has increased the footfall of parents on site compared to when we had more staggered drop off and pick up times, but we have needed to move to this model to maximise the learning time for the children. To help matters, we ask that only one parent accompanies their child onto site. In addition, should your child be in Year 4 – Year 6 it may be an opportiunity to allow them to enter site independently. There is always a member of staff on the gates and therefore once on the premises they will be safe. Furthermore, please note that the main gate on the High Street is available to children from all year groups, so parents may wish to park on the town centre and enter the site in that manner.

Disabled spaces at back and front gate

I have been asked to remind all concerned that the disabled spaces on the car parks are specifically for blue badge holders. We have a number of parents / carers who drop off / collect pupils. Please ensure that you do not use these spaces unless you have a disability.

New spelling programme in school - Pathways to Spell

The children will continue to focus on the importance of spelling words correctly and their knowledge of spelling patterns through a new teaching programme in school called 'Pathways to Spell'. Through weekly spelling lessons (Year 1 to Year 6), Pathways to Spell will:

- Ensure the children become confident and competent spellers
- Enthuse and fascinate pupils about words and language
- Develop pupils spoken language skills
- Develop an engaging spelling environment across school

A change for you as parents is the removal of weekly spellings sent home to learn. Research suggests that children learn to spell words and use them in their independent writing with more confidence when they are a daily focus in the classroom and taught as part of the curriculum rather than a weekly test.

GoRead

This year we are going paperless and have invested in a superb online reading diary called **GoRead**. The children have all been registered on the program and allocated to the new classes. Their logins will be sent out via email to you together with instructions on how to set up the app on your own devices as well as a guide on how to use the program. At the year group meetings, the staff will dedicate some time to show you how the program works and answer any questions or queries you









may have about how to use GoRead. A power point presentation will also be added to the school website for those parents unable to make the meeting.

The GoRead program allows your children to make comments about their reading, they will be shown how to do this through their tablets in school. In order for you to make a comment about your child's reading, you can either log on to the website using your child's tablet or download the app onto your phone or other electronic device. Once logged in as a **Parent** (not Child) on GoRead, you will simply have to type in the school code which is: **06835** followed by your child's specific login code. There is no maximum number of devices you can be logged in at any one time for your child, so hopefully all members of the family can get involved if they wish to.

Wrap Around Care (High Street Hub)

This week we have relaunched the wrap around care provision. The morning sessions are led by Mrs Clarke and the after-school sessions by Mrs Davies. Together they have redesigned the small hall area to make it more appropriate for out of school provision and have developed an array of new activities to suit all children. Bookings for the Hub can be made online through School Money. The feedback from the children so far has been very pleasing, but staff are always open to new ideas and suggestions.
