Dear Parents / Carers

It is somewhat with a heavy heart that I write to inform you that 2025-2026 will be my last year as Head teacher of Winsford High Street Community Primary School. I have informed the Governors of my intention to take early retirement from my role with effect from 31st August 2026. They have now set the wheels in motion to appoint my successor. In the meantime, I will continue to work hard to support the education and needs of the children in the community with the support of Mrs Robbins (Head of School), the staff and governors.

It has been an immense pleasure being Head teacher of the school for the last 22 years, serving the community and families in the area. To oversee the provision of quality education for children as well as the growth of the school and the construction of new facilities has been a very rewarding experience. My highlight has always been working with the children and seeing them learn and grow as they have progressed through the school.

Rest assured that Governors will work hard to appoint the right person to the role of Head teacher, and I will support where required to ensure a smooth transition.
